\* 2014 and 2015 GCSE results are not comparable with results from previous years, both the way in which the whole school results are calculated and the manner in which the students were assessed are different.

**However 2015 results are certainly comparable with those achieved in 2014.**

The number of marks required to gain a grade C and above was raised and the number of students achieving A/A\* has dropped nationally. The national figure for the number of students gaining 5A\*-C including English and Maths in 2013 was 59%, in 2014 it is 53%, in 2015 is likely to be 56%.

2015 marked significant increases in the success rate for students in English, Mathematics and Science. Mathematics showed a 10% rise, English 11% and Science 18%.
